# 136. The Gospel of John—14:15-18

# "The Promise of the Holy Spirit" Part 2 (3/21/21)

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Last week in our study in the Gospel of John we came to Chapter 14:15-18—

## John 14:15-18 (NKJV)

<sup>15</sup> "If you love Me, keep My commandments. <sup>16</sup> And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever-- <sup>17</sup> the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you. <sup>18</sup> I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you.

Jesus spoke these words to His disciples in an upper room somewhere in Jerusalem where they had been celebrating the Feast of Passover the night before His crucifixion.

He had just told them He was soon going to be leaving them—but that they couldn't go with Him (He would be returning to His Father in heaven after His death and resurrection).

In saying this, He was in essence telling them that they would have to carry on without Him—that just because He was going away didn't mean the work of the Kingdom was going to stop.

Upon telling them He was going to be leaving them soon and that they would have to continue the work of spreading the gospel and building God's Kingdom in His absence—their hearts were immediately gripped with fear.

How could they ever carry on the vital work of spreading the gospel without Jesus being with them?

And so, this becomes the main way Jesus encouraged His disciples that evening—by telling them He was not going to leave them alone and helpless like orphans.

Instead, He told them not to fear (verse 1), and promised them He was going to send them another Helper—the Holy Spirit who would abide with them forever (would *never* leave them).

We're calling this series "The Promise of the Holy Spirit"—and we're dividing it into 2-parts:

# I. The Person of the Holy Spirit

# II. The Power of the Holy Spirit

Last week we looked at the Person of the Holy Spirit—let's review briefly.

The Holy Spirit is a Person. He is not an "it," or an impersonal "force" like electricity that we simply "plug into" like we would a power tool into a wall outlet to then use for our benefit.

Personal pronouns are always used in the Scriptures to refer to the Holy Spirit—which we wouldn't use in talking about an impersonal force like electricity (John 14:16-17, 26; 15:26; 16:7-8, 13-15 etc.).

And further, the Bible ascribes to Him all of the characteristics of a living, thinking, feeling person (He can be *lied* to, *grieved*, *resisted*, *quenched*, *blasphemed* etc.)

The Bible not only teaches that the Holy Spirit is a Person it also teaches that He is God—even as Jesus affirmed in our text this morning:

# John 14:15-17 (NKJV)

<sup>15</sup> "If you love Me, keep My commandments. <sup>16</sup> And I will pray the Father, and He will give you <u>another</u> Helper, that He may abide with you forever-- <sup>17</sup> the Spirit of truth...

There are 2 words for "another" in Greek—

- > Heteros—another of a different kind
- > Allos—another of exactly the same kind (ice is exactly the same as water it's just in a different form)

In other words—"I am going to send you another Helper—another One exactly, essentially like Me only in a different form"—God the Spirit, Third Person of the Trinity.

"When we as children of God stop looking at Him as a power to be obtained and start seeing Him as a Person to be obeyed—our lives will never be the same."

# II. The Power of the Holy Spirit

# John 14:16 (NKJV)

<sup>16</sup> And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper...

The word "Helper" is the Greek parakletos—it comes from 2 Greek words—"para" (alongside) and "kaleo" (to call). So very simply, a parakletos is someone who has been called alongside for the purpose of helping or comforting—which is why some translations call Him the Comforter.

Jesus Himself was the <u>first</u> Parakletos—the first Comforter Who came alongside the disciples physically to help them and teach them God's truth and to train them for the work of the Kingdom (the Great Commission). But then in John 14 He told them He was going away—but He promised not to leave them alone and helpless like orphans—He was going to give them another Helper Who would come alongside them to direct, guide, teach, lead and empower them for the work Jesus had called them to do.

And on the day of Pentecost as the disciples were in the upper room praying and waiting on the Lord—the Holy Spirit was poured out and the disciples were all "filled with the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:1-4)

From that point on the one word that described them was *dynamic*—they were dynamic and successful because they were filled with and totally dependent upon the Holy Spirit. (Explain)

And as we read the book of Acts, we can see how the Holy Spirit directed the activities and ministries of the early Church—and because of it how successful they were in ministry.

As we continue reading the Book of Acts it records that in the first 30 years of the Church's existence—they turned their world upside-down for Jesus!

Think about this—they did it all without any formal theological training and without the help of radio, television, the internet, or social media!

Today by contrast we can see how ineffective and unsuccessful the Church has been in our generation in impacting the culture for Jesus Christ—with all of those 'tools' at our disposal (and please don't point to the mega-churches to prove me wrong).

I believe this is due to the fact that the Church today is depending more on the ingenuity and creativity of man in developing techniques, programs and methodologies to build the Church—rather than on the power and direction of the Holy Spirit.

## Ephesians 3:20 (NKJV)

<sup>20</sup> Now to <u>Him</u> who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us..

#### A.W. Tozer-

"If the Holy Spirit was removed from the early church 90% of what they did would have come to a halt. If the Holy Spirit was removed from the church today 10% of what we're doing would come to a halt."

## Samuel Chadwick said in the early 1900's—

"The church that multiplies committees and neglects prayer may be fussy, noisy, enterprising, but it labors in vain and spends its strength for naught. It is possible to excel in mechanics and fail in dynamics. There is an abundance of machinery; what is lacking is power."

So once again, this leads us to the focus for today's study—"The Power of the Holy Spirit".

Let me start by saying that Jesus spoke of three levels of relationship that the Holy Spirit can have with a person. These are *ascending* levels—in other words, <u>they build upon each other</u>.

Jesus outlined these levels using 3 different Greek prepositions each one corresponding to one of these levels—the first 2 come out of our text this morning:

# John 14:15-17 (NKJV)

<sup>15</sup> "If you love Me, keep My commandments. <sup>16</sup> And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever-- <sup>17</sup> the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with (para) you and will be in (en) you. (Explain)

Then we fast forward three days to Sunday, the day Jesus rose from the dead—

#### John 20:19, 21-22 (NKJV)

<sup>19</sup>Then, the same day at evening, being the first *day* of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace *be* with you."...<sup>21</sup>As the Father has sent Me, I also send you."

<sup>22</sup> And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit Who had been with them has now come inside them—in other words they were now New Testament believers—(Romans 8:9).

To see that third Greek preposition mentioned—we need to look at Acts 1:8:

#### Acts 1:8 (NKJV)

<sup>8</sup> But you shall receive <u>power</u> [Greek is dynamis] when the Holy Spirit has come <u>upon</u> you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

All Christians have the Holy Spirit <u>in</u> them—but not all Christians have the Holy Spirit <u>upon</u> them. This is what the Bible calls the "Baptism with the Holy Spirit" which is a separate and often subsequent work of the Holy Spirit in the believer's life apart from salvation.

## What Is The Baptism With The Holy Spirit?

The baptism with the Holy Spirit is the baptism of *power* that equips Christians for *service*.

It is extremely important to note that as the Lord Jesus Christ prepared to begin His public ministry—He makes it a point to walk 60 miles from Galilee down to the lower Jordan River to be baptized in the Jordan by John the Baptist.

The Lord Jesus obviously believed that this was something very important to launching His public ministry—not John's baptism in water, but the baptism that followed:

## Luke 3:21-22 (NKJV)

<sup>21</sup> When all the people were baptized, it came to pass that Jesus also was baptized; and while He prayed, the heaven was opened. <sup>22</sup> And the Holy Spirit descended in bodily form like a dove upon Him, and a voice came from heaven which said, "You are My beloved Son; in You I am well pleased."

I want you to notice the wording of verse 22—

"And the Holy Spirit descended in bodily form like a dove upon Him..."

This baptism is absolutely essential for service because it supplies the power necessary for doing the work God has called each of us to do. Remember these were simple, uneducated men—how in the world could they go into all the world and make disciples of <u>all nations</u>?

- ➤ Who would listen to them?
- > How could they impact their world for Jesus Christ being the simple Galileans that they were?

**The answer**? God was going to <u>endue</u> them with <u>supernatural power</u> from on high and was going to do the work *through* them.

Again, this is where that third Greek preposition comes into play—"with", "in" and thirdly "upon".

#### Luke 24:49 (NKJV)

<sup>49</sup> Behold, I send the Promise of My Father **upon (epi)** you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high."

#### Acts 1:4-5, 8 (NKJV)

<sup>4</sup> And being assembled together with *them,* He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, "which," *He said,* "you have heard from Me; <sup>5</sup> for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be **baptized with the Holy Spirit** not many days from now...<sup>8</sup> But you shall receive **power** when the

Holy Spirit has come **upon** you; and you shall be **witnesses to Me** in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Please understand these men knew the gospel—they had walked with Jesus for 3 ½ years and no doubt had heard Him preach the gospel thousands of times—I'm convinced they could have preached the gospel in their sleep!

And yet Jesus told them they weren't ready to go out into all the world preaching it—not until they were endued with power from on high (the Baptism with the Holy Spirit)—"So go back to Jerusalem and wait there until you receive this power..." (Luke 24:49)

The idea that we no longer need this power (as they did being simple and uneducated men) because we have our Bible colleges and seminaries to train men and women for the ministry—is patently false and utterly ridiculous!

Effective ministry isn't a matter of having an M.Div. (Masters of Divinity) or a PH. D in theology or in Pastoral Ministry—more 'head-knowledge' isn't the answer—the disciples had the head-knowledge—what they needed was the power to use it!

#### Acts 2:1-4 (NKJV)

<sup>1</sup>When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. <sup>2</sup> And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and *one* sat **upon** each of them. <sup>4</sup> And they were all **filled with the Holy Spirit**...

#### Acts 2:38-39 (NKJV)

<sup>38</sup>Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. <sup>39</sup> For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call."

The result?  $\rightarrow$  3000 men plus woman and young people were saved on that day (Pentecost).

It's very important for us to understand that Jesus, the Son of God, in His humanity waited 30 years until He was baptized with the Holy Spirit—and only then did He begin His ministry by saying—

# Luke 4:18 (NKJV)

<sup>18</sup> "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, Because He has anointed Me to preach the Gospel...

How absurd it is for us to think that we can do anything for God in the way of ministry without the same power Jesus knew He needed to do the work the Father had given Him to do.

I believe that this is one of the greatest needs in the Church today and the single greatest reason the church is so ineffective in the world in its work for God. Didn't Jesus promise us that against His Church the gates of hell would not prevail? Then why does it seem we are losing the culture war to the devil?

I believe it's because we are trying to do the work of God in our own strength, ingenuity and intelligence—and <u>not</u> in the power of the Holy Spirit. You need to understand that the three and a half years of Jesus' ministry on the earth—were not done in *His* power, as the Second Person of the Trinity—but in the power of the *Third* Person of the Trinity, the <u>Holy Spirit</u>.

#### Acts 10:38 (NKJV)

<sup>38</sup> ...how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.

That is how Jesus did the work of God and this is how we must do the work of God—in the same power of the Holy Spirit.

# The Testimony of D. L. Moody's Baptism with the Holy Spirit

"I can myself go back almost twelve years and remember two holy women who used to come to my meetings. It was delightful to see them there, for when I began to preach, I could tell by the expression of their faces they were praying for me. At the close of the Sabbath evening services they would say to me, 'We have been praying for you.' I said, 'Why don't you pray for the people?' They answered, 'You need power.' I need power,' I said to myself, 'why, I thought I had power.' I had a large Sabbath school and the largest congregation in Chicago. There were some conversions at that time, and I was in a sense satisfied. But right along these two godly women kept praying for me, and their earnest talk about 'the anointing for special service' set me thinking. I asked them to come and talk with me, and we got down on our knees. They poured out their hearts, that I might receive the anointing of the Holy Ghost. And there came a great hunger in my soul. I knew not what it was. I began to cry as never before. The hunger increased. I really felt that I did not want to live any longer if I could not have this power for service. I kept on crying all the time that God would fill me with His Spirit."

Then came the great Chicago fire. On the evening of that memorable night in 1871 when one-third of the city was laid in ashes and thousands were left homeless, Moody had preached in Farwell Hall. With the institutions which he had founded in ruins, Moody went east to appeal for funds, but he said, "My heart was not in the work of begging. I could not appeal. I was crying all the time that God would fill me with His Spirit. Well, one day, in the City of New York—oh, what a day!—I cannot describe it, I seldom refer to it; it is almost too sacred an experience to name...

I can only say that God revealed Himself to me, and I had such an experience of His love that I had to ask Him to stay His hand. I went to preaching again. The sermons were not different; I did not present any new truths, and yet hundreds were converted. I would not now be placed back where I was before that blessed experience if you should give me all the world—it would be as the small dust of the balance."

The sermons were not different; but the servant was!

The truths were not new; but now they were pungent and penetrating!

A few had been converted before; now converts came by the hundreds!"

Now let me say that if Jesus needed the power of the Holy Spirit to be effective in ministry—and Peter and Paul and men like D.L. Moody—then who do we think we are that we can live the Christian life and be involved in ministry without the Baptism with the Holy Spirit?

## "How Do I Receive This Baptism With The Holy Spirit?"

How do you receive anything from God? You simply ask in faith—

#### Luke 11:9-13 (NKJV)

<sup>9</sup> "So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. <sup>10</sup>

For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. <sup>11</sup> If a son asks for bread from any father among you, will he give him a stone? Or if *he asks* for a fish, will he give him a serpent instead of a fish? <sup>12</sup> Or if he asks for an egg, will he offer him a scorpion? <sup>13</sup> If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will *your* heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!"

Often the Baptism with the Holy Spirit doesn't come upon a Christian's life until there is a brokenness.

I'd like to share with you just a little from the life of Dr. Walter Wilson as recorded in the book, "They Found the Secret."

The author tells us that Dr. Wilson was converted to Christ on a December night in 1896, afterward—

"...he became a lover of the Scriptures and became diligent in teaching, preaching and distributing tracts. Much effort, however, seemed to produce little result, and no apparent success followed his labors. This ineffectiveness troubled him, but he was told by others 'not to look for results, but only to be busy at seed sowing.'"

This went on for 17 years until January 14, 1914 when he heard a message given by Dr. James Gray, who later went on to become the president of Moody Bible Institute, on the need to surrender our lives fully to the Holy Spirit to accomplish His work.

Upon hearing this message, Dr. Wilson went home and there laid on the floor of his room, utterly heartbroken over his fruitless life, he cried out to the Holy Spirit and said,

"My Lord, I have mistreated You all my Christian life. I have treated You like a servant. When I wanted You, I called for You; when I was about to engage in some work, I beckoned You to come and help me perform my task. I have kept You in the place of a servant.

I have sought to use You only as a willing servant to help me in my self-appointed and chosen work. I shall do so no more. Just now I give You this body of mine; from my head to my feet, I give it to You. I give You my hands, my limbs, my eyes and lips, my brain; all that I am within and without, I hand over to You for You to live in it the life that You please. You may send this body to Africa or lay it on a bed with cancer. You may blind the eyes or send me with Your message to Tibet. You may take this body to the Eskimos or send it to a hospital with pneumonia. It is Your body from this moment on. Help yourself to it. Thank you, my Lord, I believe You have accepted it..."

If you think that that prayer is bizarre or fanatical—it's because you neither understand nor have experienced brokenness in your life for God—(Explain)

The author goes on to say from that day on Dr. Wilson's life was dramatically and forever changed—he went on to become a tremendous soul winner, all because he came to a place of brokenness and surrender—coupled with the Baptism with the Holy Spirit.

#### R.A. Torrey—

"The lack of this absolute surrender is shutting many out of the blessing today. People turn the keys of almost every closet in their heart over to God, but there is some small closet of which they wish to keep the key for themselves, and the blessing does not come."
